Bible Story

Looking back (last week):

- ☞ What are your main “takeaways” from this last week?
- ☞ Go over the completed Quiz **or** give it as an open-book test
- ☞ Have everyone report on reading the selected passage 6 times a day.
- ☞ What insights have you collected this last week?
- ☞ How are you keeping them?

Learning a Bible story:

- Form groups of 5 or 6 people. Everyone within each group will be learning the same story. The other groups in the room will be learning different stories. Assign one of the following stories to each group
 - Ten Men Healed – Luke 17:11-19
 - Persistent Widow – Luke 18:1-8
 - Pharisee and Tax Collector – Luke 18:9-14
 - Centurion’s Servant – Luke 7:1-10
 - Widow’s Son – Luke 7:11-17
- Put away all the Bibles, except one per group.
- The first person in the circle reads the story from the Bible, loud enough so everyone can hear.
- Close the Bible after the reading, with only a bookmark or finger saving the location of the story.
- The second person in the circle tells the story (the best they can). Others in the circle can help, but no one can look at the Bible for help.
- Once the second individual has told the story, that person opens the group Bible and reads the story aloud.
- The third person tells it (with help, but not from the Bible).
- Once the third individual has told the story, that person opens the Bible again and reads the story.
- The fourth person tells it and once again reads it from the Bible. This is the last time the story is read.
- The fifth person tells the story

- After the sixth person tells the story, continue around the circle telling the story until person number three has told it again.
- If there is more than one group, everyone is to select a person from each of the other groups and tell them their story. Then listen to their story.

Homework for this week:

- ☞ Encourage everyone to continue reading the selected passage six times a day for another week — two times each morning, afternoon, and night.
- ☞ Have them tell the story they learned five times this next week to five different people (or groups) who are not a part of the class.
- ☞ Encourage everyone to sign up for the “story of the day” found on the resource page on the website
